Bushey and South West Herts Youth Drama Festival

Rules - One Act Play

- A One Act play may be entered or an excerpt from a longer play provided it is intelligible to a
 member of the audience who has not seen the whole play
- There must be a title and acknowledged author(s)
- Be performed in the English language

Less than 20 minutes

- A full script must be supplied to the adjudicator
- One video recording (producer's copy only) may be made of a play provided that authorisation has been obtained from the festival organisers

Age Groups

Senior Section

- Performers must be under the age of 25 on 1st September of the previous year
- Younger performers in this section will be eligible for Junior Section awards

Junior Section

- Performers must be year 9 or below on 1st September of the previous year
- Older performers are permitted, by prior arrangement, but are not eligible for awards

Disqualification

Cast

- There must be 3 or more performers in any one play
- A performer may be in more than one production

Time Limits

The play must be 20 minutes to 50 minutes long. The time limits are reinforced by penalties as follows:

Over 50 minutes by:	
1 minute	1 point deducted
2 minutes	3 points deducted
3 minutes	6 points deducted
4 minutes	10 points deducted
5 minutes	15 points deducted
Over 5 minutes	Disqualification!

Disqualification does not affect any other entries made.

The timing of a play will start as the curtains open, once the lights are up or as the music starts, whichever is relevant, and end when the curtains are closed or on blackout.

Stage and Set

Set Time - 10 minutes from a blank stage to being ready to perform Strike Time - 5 minutes

- The scenery must fit the stage and this should be checked at the technical rehearsal
- It is the performing group's responsibility to set and strike, however the festival backstage team are available to help, if requested
- A maximum of 10 people (including festival backstage team) may be used as stage crew for a production
- The timings will be monitored by the Stage Manager who will inform the adjudicator if time limits are exceeded
- Costumes, sets and props can be hired, borrowed or created
- All properties and scenery to be fire proofed

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
